
The Second Sunday of Epiphany Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Sunday and the Eve of the Inauguration January 19, 2025



On the first day of school, Ruby and her classmates entered the building surrounded by Federal Marshals to protect them from the angry crowd that had gathered. The police could keep the crowd from using physical violence, but they couldn't protect the children from verbal abuse. Day after day, the six-year-old Ruby walked through a crowd that called her every profanity imaginable. Threats against her and her family were an everyday occurrence. Ruby quit eating for a while because one heckler threatened to poison her and her family.

Every evening when she went home, Ruby would pray for those abusing her. She would even pray for them while she was walking to school, through the crowd. She did this, she told me, because "Christ told me to do it. Christ told me to forgive these people because they don't know what they're doing."
