Today we celebrate "Epiphany," a celebration of light and revelation. The name comes from a Greek word ("phos") that means "light." To have an "epiphany" is to have the light come on, to see things in a new light. For Christians, the first Epiphany was when the Wise Ones finally found their way to Bethlehem and saw the Light of the World in the dust of the stable. Today the children (and a few adults) lead us on that journey to Bethlehem—and beyond—telling the story through the eyes and voices of all creation.

The service reflects United's ongoing commitment to learn from and care for God's creation. We invite you to open your hearts and souls so that, like the birds, camels, cats, sheep, dogs, and all the rest of creation that first Christmas, we too might "see the light"—and God's Light in a new way. May we join with creation to sing God's praise for the birth of Christ and treasure the gift of Life and Light God gave us at Christmas and gives us every day.
